During the cold winter months, SR 20, the road through Washington Pass is closed. Every May, WSDOT clears the roadway of snow and ice and opens the road through traffic.

The morning of April 22nd arrived with the volition of a freight train. With an eye on the clock Sonya and I loaded up our red rocket and hit the open road. Based on prior experience, for opening day, we arrived at the Ross Lake gate at 11:00 am. Sadly, the gate was already open and traffic was moving when we arrived. I would suggest arriving much earlier, say around 9:00 am , if you want to see the gate opened. After a pit stop at the facilities at the gate, we proceeded through the gate and into the pass. As traffic was already moving,



there wasn't a traffic accordion, so there was lots of space between vehicles. This helps when it comes to taking pictures.

We drove a few miles before encountering snow. Once we did, it's quantity quickly amassed. Each side of the roadway had a wall of snow between five and six feet, just behind the shoulder line and/or guardrail, giving the drive an almost tunnel feel.

The drive was invigorating with twist, turns and the wild beauty of nature. The highlight of the drive is the hairpin in the middle of Washington Pass. There are spots to pull off, so that you can get out and take pictures.

The east side of the pass is less dense forest wise, and thins out more as you proceed east towards Winthrop. Shortly after the hairpin, we turned around and headed back home. We ended a great drive with lunch at the Marblemount Diner.
